

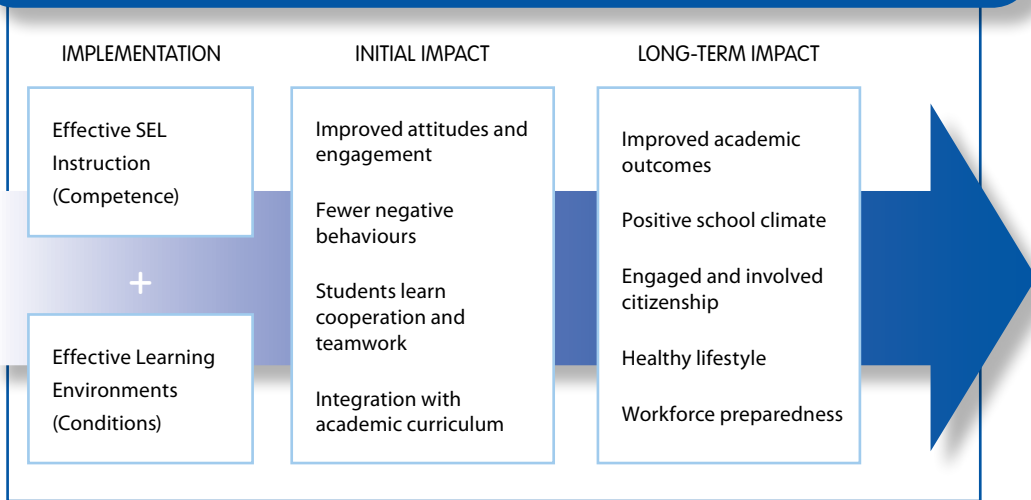
Emphasising Service

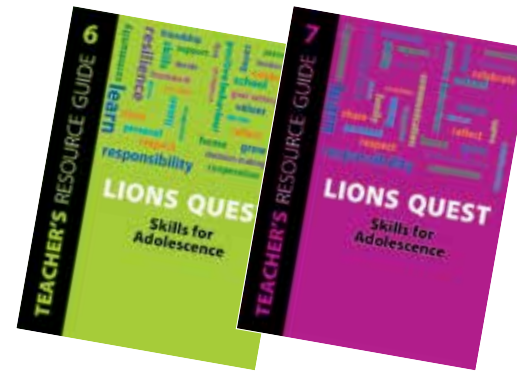
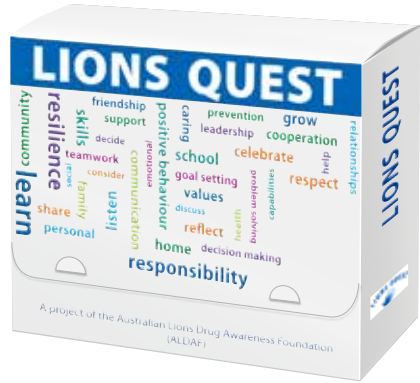


School implementation

Skills for Growing Foundation – Year 5
